5.	MATTERS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> WR noted that a correction needed to be made to para 3 under General Matters: "A non-profit company was in the process of being formed to formalise the work that had been done by Dan Hunt over the past 10 years in maintaining the Zandspruit river from Kelvin Road northwards towards 12th Avenue as well as in cleaning the streets of Rivonia in an effort to prevent urban decay. This was being undertaken by Amy Harrison, Dan Hunt and WR of Ward 106. The aim is to formalise this venture and to involve the businesses within Rivonia to become involved and both businesses and residents to finance the upkeep of the area. This would not replace the once a month A-Re-Sebetseng project but would both offer employment and be operative on a day to day / monthly basis. All community leaders in the area are welcome to participate and a special invitation has been sent out to involve the Chinese community. Please contact Wendy Robertson for further information. 6.	SAPS REPORT BACK: Sector 1 – CAPTAIN SEMENYA - Acting Sector Commander <ul style="list-style-type: none"> As Lt. Col. Reggie Pillay had unexpectedly died that afternoon no report was provided and CaptS excused himself from the remainder of the meeting after a minute of silence had been observed. 	Community Awareness
7.	JMPD REPORT BACK: Sector 1 – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Not present 	Community Awareness
8.	GENERAL / ANY OTHER BUSINESS: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> AF raised an objection to the fact that the Councillors of both Wards 106 and 93 very seldom attend these meetings. WR pointed out that they are paid and that it is their duty to do so. FP will follow up and report back at the September meeting. He further objected that JMPD also never attend and that this is unacceptable. WR commented that this has always been a challenge but that they do come to the monthly Forum meeting and that it is up to the chair persons to address any / all complaints. However JMPD do attend Sector 2, 3 and 4 meetings. FP will also take this up as residents have complaints about their law enforcement generally and need to communicate directly with them. The Chief Guardian is presently in hospital and therefore the Sector 1 Guardians programme is on hold until further notice. 	Community Awareness

11.	SECURITY COMPANIES: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> SB of FADT advised this would be his last meeting as he was being retired from the company. He noted the following: In the security meetings held at CCJ every Monday morning Sector 1 featured nearly every week as being of concern due to the high levels of crime, in particular Edenburg, Rivonia, Wendywood and to a lesser extent Gallo Manor. He intends motivating for extra FADT patrols which have been successful elsewhere. Sunninghill crime tends to come in waves but is not as consistent. AM observed the busy days had been Mondays and Tuesdays. JT questioned whether the road works along Bowling may have contributed which SB confirmed as well as noting there was quite a lot of building activity taking place. In addition the Sector has two rivers (Braamfontein Spruit and Zandspruit). FP brought up that she had received a number of complaints against SAPS but that the victims had not followed the correct procedure and it was therefore not possible to follow them up. In some cases incidents are not even reported. JT sends out the reporting protocol via WhatsApp and to the database on a regular basis. It was emphasised that this is the only way in which SAPS can operate and it is therefore essential that it is observed. OG of 24/7 was introduced by WR and gave a rundown of the area in which the company mostly operates in Woodmead and Khyber Rock. CM has been trying to motivate more security companies operating in the Sector to take part in the monthly meetings. FP has given her assurance that once she is fully recovered and back working a normal day she will throw her weight behind 	Community Awareness
